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4- The coherence of education is the harmony and match the level of education of the spouses.

5- Equality in mental and spiritual affairs, which includes the level of intelligence, personality type, religious beliefs, and so on.

THE EFFECTS OF MATRIMONIAL MARRIAGES FROM PSYCHOLOGISTS

One of the important effects of matrimonial marriages is to increase marital satisfaction among spouses. Marital satisfaction is an important factor in the mental health and vitality of individuals. According to the definition, marital satisfaction is a condition in which the husband and wife are married to each other and are happy with each other (Lutz, 1905).

Winch et al Contend that marital satisfaction is an adaptation between the status quo and the expected situation. According to this definition, marital satisfaction is achieved when the condition of the marital relationship matches the person's expected situation. Ellis also states that marital satisfaction is an objective sentiment of pleasure, satisfaction and enjoyment experienced by a woman or husband when they consider all aspects of their marriage (Brynin, Longhi, & Pérez, 2008), despite the wide variations in the concept of family and the opening of societies, the chance of marriage Widely marriage is still a powerful factor in marriage, which reduces the level of anxiety in spouses, in addition, the coherence of married couples whose socio-political attitudes become closer to each other (Soleimanian, 1995). Several studies, including by Grames, Miller, Robinson, Higgins, and Hinton (2008), have shown evidence of the effects of marital satisfaction on mental illness and depression. They randomly selected 632 married people from across the United States, 275 men and 357 women with an average age of 43.7 years. Two questions were used to assess the physical health. The first question was: How much do you know about your physical health compared to your peers and your year?

Listeners were forced to submit their response as one of four great, good, moderate and poor options. The second question about physical conditions was the choice of a disease or pain from a list of 21 illnesses or physical illnesses that included diabetes, alcoholism, and heart problems, and of course they could list themselves if they had another illness. To assess mental health, the subjects were asked to consider the three-dimensional (Relational Ethics Scale) RES, RDAS (Revised Dyadic Adjustment Scale) and the CES-D Center for Studies Depression Scale Which were used to assess the health of relationships, mutual compatibility and depression. The results of the study showed that people with higher marital satisfaction had significantly lower depression and less physical health problems. Hagedoorn et al. (2000), showed that cancer patients with a higher marital satisfaction had fewer negative feelings about the course of treatment and its severity compared to those with marital satisfaction. The benefits of marital satisfaction are not confined to sick people and involve everyone. Many articles have shown that with increasing marital satisfaction, family violence also decreases. Another study showed that marital satisfaction is effective in the amount of satisfaction and happiness after the birth of the first child and the severity of the hardship, so that the spouses who had the highest marital satisfaction before the birth of the first child, after the consent of the child (Lawrence, Rothman, Cobb, Rothman, & Bradbury, 2008) it has been shown repeatedly that a particular type of homogeneity, namely, religious equality in marriage, is beneficial and has a direct impact on the sense of marital satisfaction. Given the various interpretations that have emerged in the construction of societies. The influence of the geographical factor on the choice of the spouse has been reduced. These improvements, which have been created in most areas of transportation and communication, have actually reduced the geography factor. Kennedy, in a comparison between two studies conducted in Newhaven about pre-marital adjacency, has been disagreed with the results of the reduction in the impact of this factor. He believes that despite the increase in the number of those who move, the impact of the geographic factor is on the rise. But it seems to us difficult to generalize this conclusion to the sum of alliances of our time. From what we have said so far about geographic mobility, it can be concluded that the birthplace of other people does not exactly depend on their place of residence during marriage and the number of marriages performed between different or different nationalities it will be. Increasingly. According to Marshall: Marriages between French and Muslims that had been exceptional for up to half a century ago and have been rare for thirty years ago, have now become abundant. But it should be noted that in spite of all the improvements in the areas of communication that liberate people from geographical impact, this factor still affects the choice of candidates during marriage; we must know that the geographic factor is not alone in labor, but with other elements Which are part of the humanitarian system, are combined. In fact, if all the obstacles in this area are overcome, the reunion of these people will not be accidental. 1- Men want to marry younger men.

2- Whenever possible, they are older at marriage. An average age difference between her and her husband would be higher(Pollard et al., 1959)

But the question that may have struck the minds of all researchers is whether the very separation between Sunni spouses leads to a change in the way of thinking and deed, and thus a particular difficulty in marital satisfaction? In response, it should be said that according to the research carried out in this field, they are all singing with the view that the similarity of Sunnis is equivalent to the best balance in family life. According to Carlson, expectations of people's attitudes vary in age. F) Equal partnership In terms of income
